Fiscal Year Funding



October 2016 -September 2017

The ACHC received **\$1,109,813.84** for fiscal year 2016-2017 from Oakland Community Health Network (OCHN). OCHN and its network of service providers identify, influence, and deliver public mental health services to more than 25,000 Oakland County citizens.

The ACHC was awarded a **\$125,000** grant from the Drug-Free Communities (DFC) Support Program. These grants are meant to provide local community coalitions funding to prevent youth substance use, including prescription drugs, marijuana, tobacco and alcohol.

The ACHC's efforts to mentor Genesee County Community Coalition and Lakes Area Community Coalition were increased thanks to a **\$75,000** grant from the Drug-Free Communities Mentoring Support Program (DFCM). Extensive training on the Strategic Prevention Framework and capacity building to increase prevention efforts were a strong focus this year.

Other donations consisted of things that the ACHC did throughout the year such as special events and support of donors resulting in funding to the ACHC of **\$20,000**.
