REACHING PEOPLE IN 2019



The Alliance worked hard this year to reach people - getting out into the community educating, speaking, supporting and encouraging...

- 57 Shatter the Stigma Support Group meetings across Oakland County
- Save A Life Narcan Trainings trained 1,343 adults and 125 Youth in the administration of nasal Narcan at 34 community based trainings, 9 school districts and 8 independent businesses
- 28 Wellness events reaching over 2,000 people
- For FY 2018/19, Keep Them Safe, Keep Them Healthy school prevention programming served 3,551 students and 203 adults from 20 middle and high schools; 1 church; 3 community presentations and 8 parent presentations. Additionally, Life is Your Playbook served 2,275 youth and 135 adults through 7 high schools; 4 middle schools and 3 summer mini camps

HIGHLIGHTS



In partnership with The Restore Foundation, Resolve was developed and piloted to help people in their recovery walk. Implementation at Turning Point, Grace Centers of Hope, and Doorway to Recovery began in January 2019. In total we've reached 250 people through these trainings.



Continued partnership with Oakland University to increase mental health resources and implementation of positive community norms initiative.



The Alliance distributed retail education packets to 500 vendors in Oakland County in preparation for the Synar Inspection Period (June 1 - 30, 2019). All coalitions participated and completed compliance checks county wide.

SAMHSA

Awarded the **Partnership for Success** grant managed by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), Center Substance Abuse Prevention (CSAP).



Designated a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization in 2004. Licensed by Michigan's Bureau of Health Care Services. Federal, State, and/or County funding has been provided through the Oakland County Community Health Network Substance Use Disorder Services to support the project costs. Published January 2020.

FISCAL YEAR

October 2018 - September 2019

OCHN \$1,597,499.01

The Alliance received \$1,597,499.01 for fiscal year 2018-2019 from Oakland Community Health Network (OCHN). OCHN and its network of service providers identify, influence, and deliver public mental health services to more than 25,800 Oakland County citizens.

DFC \$125,000.00

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The Alliance was awarded a \$125,000 grant from the Drug-Free Communities (DFC) Support Program. These grants are meant to provide local community coalitions funding to prevent youth substance use, including prescription drugs, marijuana, tobacco and alcohol.

Donations \$75,973.00

Other donations consisted of things that the Alliance did throughout the year such as special events and support of donors resulting in funding to the Alliance of \$75,973.00.
